

Sample Ballot Notice of General Election — November 2, 2004

OFFICE OF THE GREEN COUNTY CLERK TO THE ELECTORS OF GREEN COUNTY

Notice is hereby given of a general election to be held in the several wards in the County of Green, on the 2nd day of November, 2004, at which the officers named below shall be chosen. The names of the candidates for each office, whose nominations have been certified to or filed in this office, are given under the title of the office and under the appropriate party or other designation, each in its proper column, together with the questions submitted to a vote, in the sample ballot below.

INFORMATION TO ELECTORS

Upon entering the polling place, an elector shall give his or her name and address before being permitted to vote. Where ballots are distributed to electors, the initials of two inspectors must appear on the ballot. Upon being permitted to vote, the elector shall retire alone to a voting booth or machine and cast his or her ballot, except that an elector who is a parent or guardian may be accompanied by the elector's minor child or minor ward. An election official may inform the elector of the proper manner for casting a vote, but the official may not in any manner advise or indicate a particular voting choice.

At the general election, if an elector wishes to cast a straight party vote for all candidates nominated by any party, the elector shall select the party of his or her choice and connect the arrow or fill in the oval next to the party designation.

A straight party vote is a vote for the party's candidates listed on the ballot, unless the elector casts a vote for a candidate of another party, writes in the name of a candidate or applies a sticker. A straight party vote cannot be cast for Independent candidates.

To vote for individual candidates fill in the oval or connect the arrow next to the candidate's name.

To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the elector shall write the name of the candidate of his or her choice in the space provided for a write-in vote, and fill in the oval or connect the arrow on the write-in line.

An elector must cast a vote for President and Vice President jointly on one ticket. To vote for persons whose names do not appear on the ballot, write in the names of individuals for both offices on the lines provided. A write-in vote for only a vice presidential candidate will not be counted.


On referenda questions the elector shall fill in the oval or connect the arrow next to "yes" if in favor of the question, or the elector shall fill in the oval or connect the arrow next to "no" if opposed to the question.

If an elector spoils a ballot, he or she shall return it to an election official who shall issue another ballot in its place, but not more than three ballots shall be issued to any one elector. If the ballot has not been initialed by two inspectors or is defective in any other way, the elector shall return it to an election official who shall issue a proper ballot in its place. Not more than five minutes' time shall be allowed inside a voting booth. Unofficial ballots or a memorandum to assist the elector in marking his or her vote may be taken into the booth and copied. The sample ballot shall not be shown to anyone so as to reveal how the ballot is marked.

After casting his or her vote, the elector shall leave the voting booth, properly deposit the ballot into the voting device, and promptly leave the polling place.

An elector may select an individual to assist in casting his or her vote if the elector declares to the presiding official that he or she is unable to read, has difficulty reading, writing, or understanding English, or that due to disability is unable to cast his or her ballot. The selected individual rendering assistance may not be the elector's employer or an agent of that employer or an officer or agent of a labor organization which represents the elector.

DO NOT USE RED INK!

To vote for the candidate of your choice, completely darken the oval to the LEFT of the candidate's name like this . To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, write the person's name on the line provided and darken the oval to the LEFT of the line.

STRAIGHT PARTY

If you desire to vote a straight party ticket for all federal, legislative, state and county offices, darken the oval to the LEFT of the party of our choice. A straight party vote cannot be cast for Independent candidates. To vote for individual candidates of your choice, completely darken the oval to the LEFT of the name.
