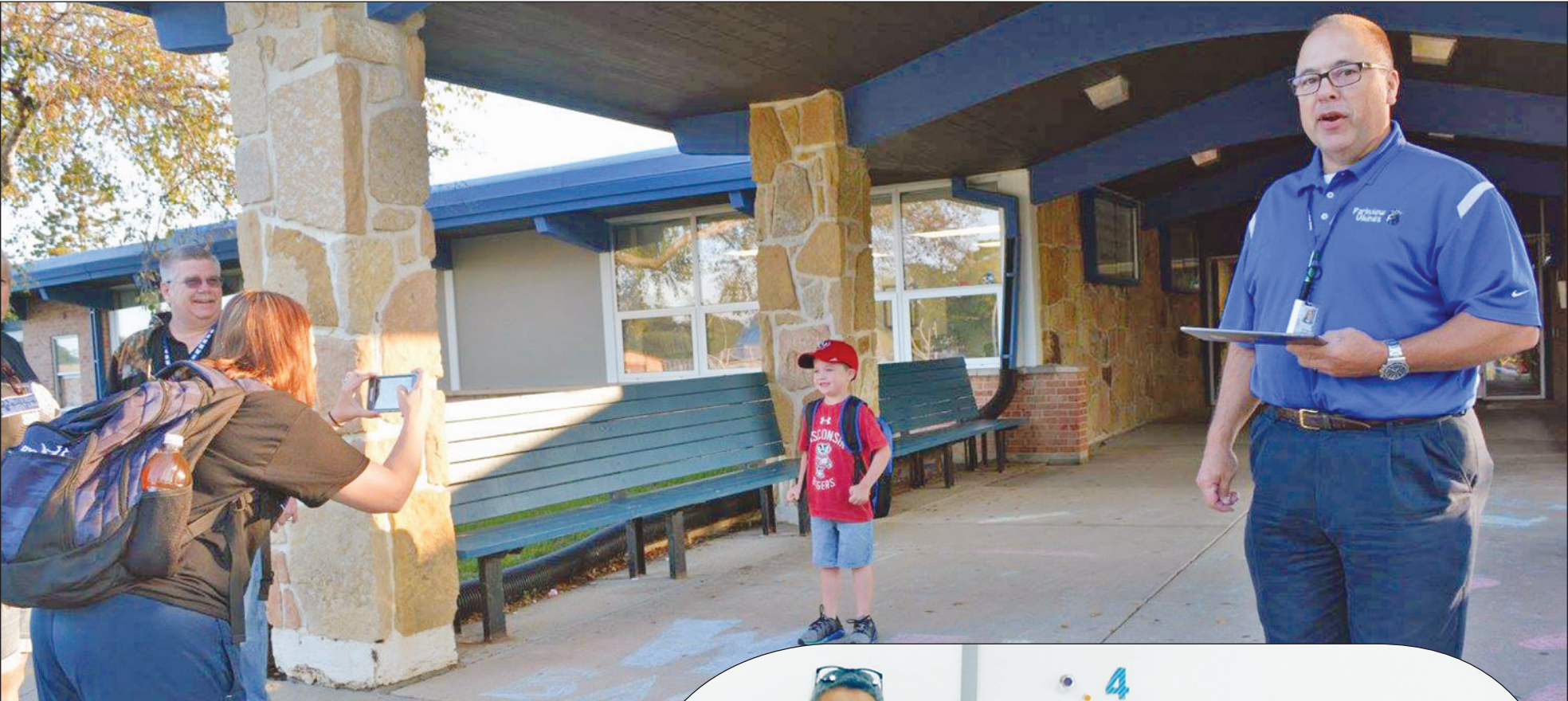

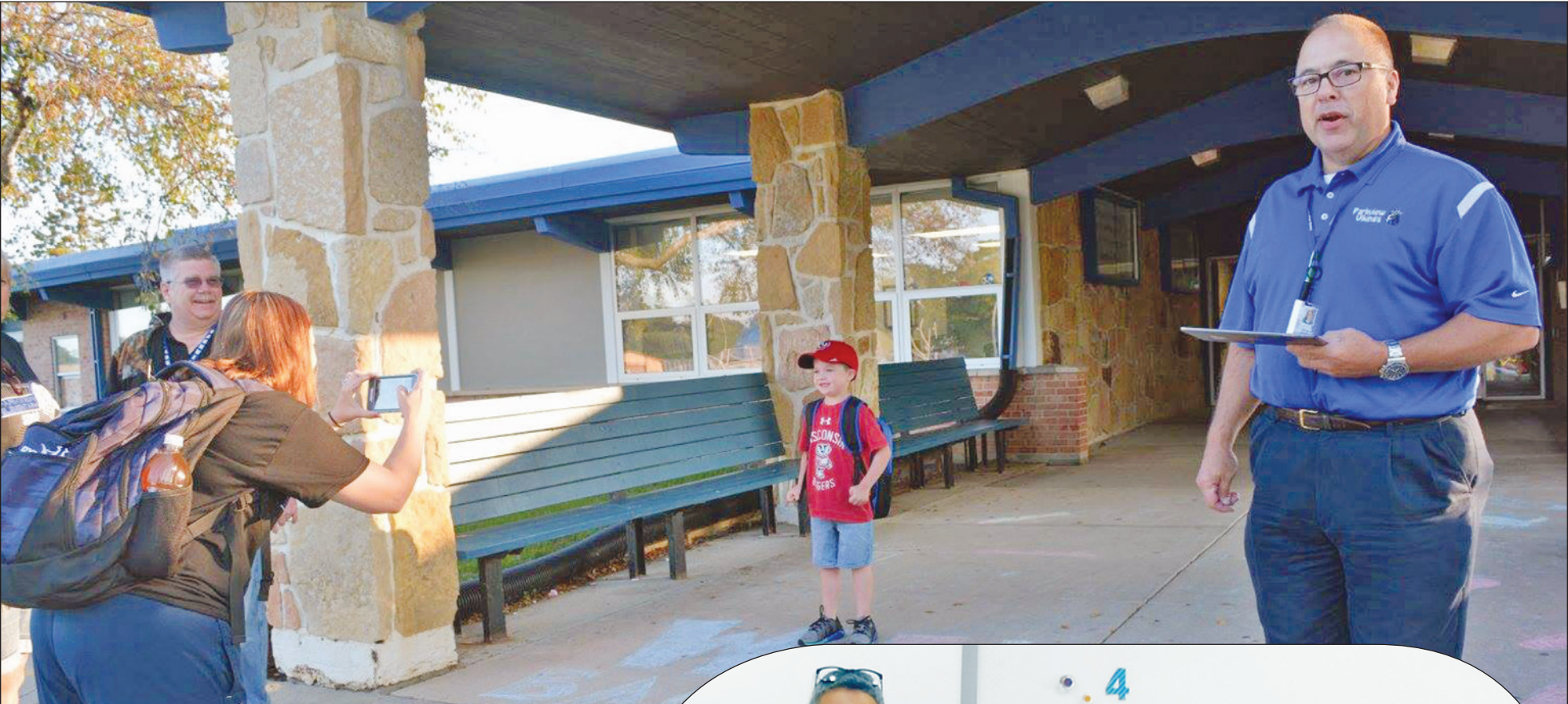

Decatur Lake management meeting

A Decatur Lake Management Plan Meeting will be held on Sunday, Sept. 10, from 1 to 3 p.m., at the Bank of Brodhead

In mid-August, a team of water resource engineers conducted a thorough boat tour of Decatur Lake and upstream Sugar River.

The purpose of this excursion was to collect water and sediment samples and make on-site observations of these waterways. These activities add to a quite extensive collection of data on these bodies of water, and will be used to help provide alternatives for a long-term Lake Management Plan for Decatur Lake.

This project is funded by a Lake Planning Grant awarded by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources to Decatur Lake Mill Race Association (DLMRA).

The results of this project will be shown at an interactive, community-wide meeting to be held at the Bank of Brodhead from 1 to 3 p.m. on Sunday, 10. This informative

event will kick off with a social hour from noon to 1 p.m. Enjoy refreshments and appetizers while mingling with your neighbors.

Meet the Professionals
Steve Gaffield, PhD, PE, a Hydrologist and Nick Hayden, MS, GISP, a Water Resource Engineer both work with Montgomery Associates Resource Solutions in Cottage Grove, Wis.

Dave Marshall, an environmental consultant, operates Underwater Habitat Investigations LLC in Barneveld, Wis.

Lauren Brown has a professional design background in landscape architecture, and academic and applied knowledge in the field of river and wetland restoration. Through her work at LV Brown Studio LLC in Madison, Wis., her illustrative design drawings help viewers envision the ideas the professional team has devised.

This team will present their findings and recommendations on how

to best manage Decatur Lake and the upstream Sugar River.

Free Water Nitrate Testing Offered

Sen. Ringhand: Dark Store Legislation would restore property tax fairness in Wisconsin

What would you think if the value of your property was determined by comparing your home to a blighted, abandoned house on the other side of town? Certainly, the two houses are not the same. The family that takes the time to maintain their home and property would not want to sell their home for the same price as an abandoned and blighted property in another part of town.

Commercial retailers and corporations have developed a similar property tax scheme called the "Dark Store Theory" to lower the value of their commercial property and shift their property tax burden onto local homeowners.

The "Dark Store Theory" is currently being deployed by corporations throughout Wisconsin. Some corporations believe that the new Super Center they just built has the same property value as an old, abandoned store that they have left behind.

Throughout Wisconsin, big box chains and other commercial property owners are challenging their property taxes by arguing that the value of their new property is the same as an abandoned, or "dark" property in a different location. Often, the "dark" property being used as an example is property that the corporation just abandoned to move to a new location.

What the corporations are doing is rigging the system against every-

day people and homeowners. They believe that their property should be compared to the empty and blighted store they have abandoned, not the actual value of the new store that was recently built and opened.

Make no mistake, by shifting their property tax burden, the commercial property owners are sticking it to local homeowners. It seems that the only people who believe that the Dark Store tax scheme is fair are the lawyers who developed the scheme, the lobbyists who are defending the scheme and the corporations who are making both rich.

The Senate Committee on Revenue, Financial Institutions and Rural Affairs heard testimony on Wednesday regarding two bi-partisan bills that I have co-authored to address this growing problem in Wisconsin.

Senate Bill 291 would allow assessors to consider any applicable lease provisions and the actual rent pertaining to a property in determining the assessed value of that property.

Senate Bill 292 simply states that vacant or "dark property" cannot be used as a comparison when determining the value of a fully operational and occupied property.

These two bills are designed to restore fairness to local property assessments and to stop shifting the property tax burden from commercial retailers to homeowners.

Hopefully, these bi-partisan bills will become law before the legislative session ends next spring.

In a photo finish for 33rd Albany junior Kaitlyn Trow clipped Wisconsin Heights' Sydney Green by .1 at a personal best time of 23:02.2. Sophomore Kristin O'Bel placed 46th at a personal best 23:31.9 while junior Madison

Peters took 48th with a personal best mark of 23:33.9. Freshman Alyssa Knauf came in 70th with a personal best time of 24:56.7 and freshman Lily Brewer took 79th at 25:33.1.

In the boys varsity race, junior Josh Dahl led the Comets with a 15th place finish in a time of 18:20.6. Senior Garrett Hlavachek placed 63rd in a season best time of 20:22.8 and senior Logun Parker captured 64th at a season best mark of 20:24.1. Sophomore Josef Schirgi took 86th in a personal best time of 21:52.3. Freshman Luke Johnson earned 93rd in a time of 22:20.9.

In the boys junior varsity race, freshman Owen Baertschi earned

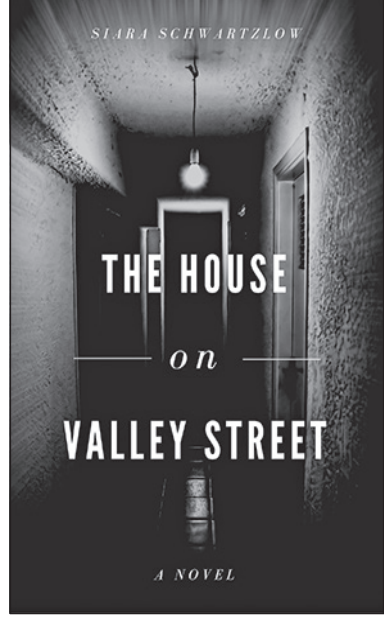

Panthers volleyball stumbles at Blackhawk

The Juda Panthers (4-4-2 overall record, 0-2 Six Rivers) dropped their second straight Six Rivers eastern division contest as Juda fell to Black Hawk in three sets 20-25, 18-25 and 11-25 last Thursday.

The opening set was a seesaw affair as there were seven different lead changes in the early stages. A service ace by senior Hailey Kammerer evened the set at three. Senior outside hitter Maddie Roth tattooed an outside smash to put the Panthers up 7-5.

The turning point in set one came when the Warriors went on a 4-0 run to go up 18-12. Bailey Butler drilled a loud outside spike and Sydney Delzer hammered a middle kill to the back row to spark the run.

Trailing 19-13 Juda answered with a key 4-0 run to get the momentum back. Junior middle Hannah Powers dug a ball and later in the rally Roth drilled an outside smash during the 4-0 surge.

Freshman stand-out Butler answered with three kills as part of the Warriors game-changing 5-0 run to go up 24-17. Her third kill was an indefensible cross-court spike on the outside. Butler utilized that shot on a number of occasions throughout the match, and was a force on the left side, as the Panthers had no answer for her.

"Butler was hitting above the block and that's a big deal," head coach Scott Anderson said.

Black Hawk jumped out to a 5-0 lead in set two. Hannah Butler tattooed two outside spikes to spark the quick start. The Panthers clawed back to cut the deficit to 8-6. Senior outside hitter Erika Duecker smoked a middle

kill and Roth tattooed an outside spike down the line to fuel the surge.

The Warriors stormed back with an 8-3 run to take a commanding 16-9 lead. Black Hawk came up with a couple huge blocks during the momentum swing. The Panthers continued to fight as they trimmed the deficit to 19-15. Roth, who had a big game, laced an outside spike through two blockers and Kammerer delivered a solo block on Bailey Butler to ignite the spurt.

"Roth hit pretty solid tonight. The problem was not enough attempts," Anderson said. "Our passing was too far away from the net . . . When she's setting from 12 feet away you're not going to have good attacks."

Black Hawk came back with a 3-0 run to go up 22-15 and dash any hopes of a Panthers set two comeback. The Warriors again turned to Butler and she delivered with an outside smash to the vacant middle of the court. Savanna Burmeister dialed up a key ace for the Warriors. Burmeister torched the Panthers serve receive with a match-high three aces.

The third set was all Warriors as Black Hawk raced out to an 11-3 lead. Butler executed a soft kill on the outside and Delzer connected on a middle spike during the scorching start.

Roth tattooed a spike and senior middle Zoe Rathsack served up an ace to make the score 7-3. The Panthers were never able to get into system against the Warriors.

Winter semi-tractor parking permits available

The Brodhead Police Department reminds City residents who own or operate a semi-tractor and wish to park their units at their residence between Sunday, Oct. 1, 2017, and Sunday, April 1, 2018 must obtain a permit. Permits are available at the police department. There is a \$50 non-refundable fee to process the permit application.

City Ordinances 480-51C(2), Off-Street Parking Restrictions in Residential Areas, and 432-9, Heavy Traffic Routes allows City residents who operate or own a semi-tractor, but not a trailer, to park it at their residence if they are issued a permit by the Police Department.

Prior to approving a permit the Police Department must notify neighbors or adjacent properties within 70 feet of the applicant's property, the Public Works Department and City utilities.

If a permit is issued the semi-tractor must be parked on a driveway which is either paved or graveled. If a permit is issued to a City resident and they have to drive off a City designated heavy traffic route to reach their residence, they must take the shortest route from the nearest heavy truck route to their residence.

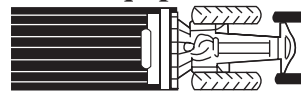
