Local dairy companies garner state grants

Four local dairy companies are among 15 state companies that will receive dairy processor grants in 2021 from the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection. The grants are designed to foster innovation, improve profitability and sustain the long-term viability of Wisconsin's dairy processing facilities.

"Dairy processors are key to bolstering Wisconsin's position as a national and global leader in the dairy industry," Randy Romanski, DATCP secretary-designee, said in a news release. "Our processors need to constantly innovate and adapt to changing times. These grants are designed to help processors accomplish those goals and continue contributing to Wisconsin's thriving dairy industry."

A total of \$200,000 was available for this year's dairy processor grants, with a maximum \$50,000 allowed for each project. DATCP received 18 grant requests totaling more

than \$630,000.

As part of the 2021-'23 budget, Gov. Tony Evers has proposed increasing the available funding for such grants to \$600,000 each year to address the need for additional support to the dairy industry, the release said.

Grant recipients are required to provide a match of at least 20 percent of the grant amount. The local grant recipients and their planned projects are:

- Decatur Dairy of Brodhead, purchase of engineering involved in building a warehouse that will store product.

- Chalet Cheese, Monroe, installation of a new separator and cream tank.

- Maple Leaf Cheese, Monroe, creation of a marketing program and business framework for including a more diverse production and distribution system.

- Rolling Hills Dairy, Monroe, diversification to re-define role and offer quality cheese in a farm-to-table theme.

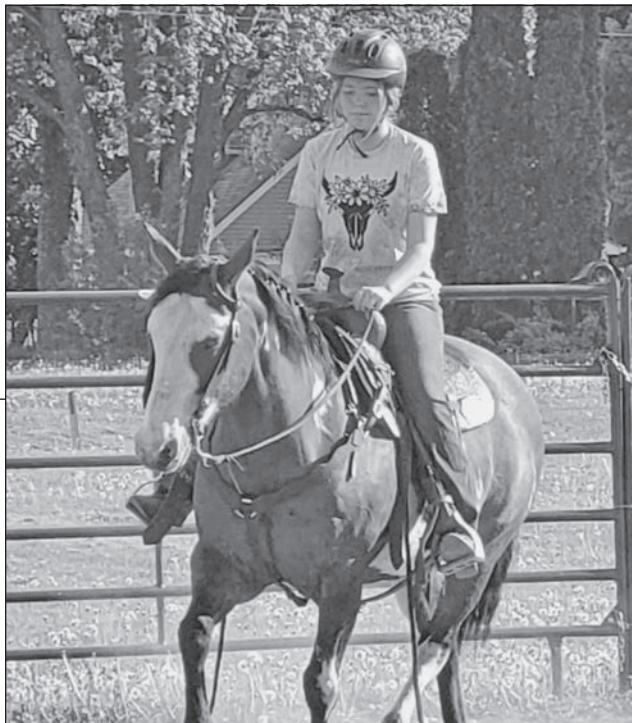
"Youth learn about the safe

Art museum reopens without appointments starting June 1

After being closed for 14 months due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Monroe Arts Center will reopen to the public without the need to make an appointment starting Tuesday, June 1.

Exhibits in the Wellington, Muranyi and Frehner galleries can be viewed during regular business hours, which are 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday through Friday and 10 a.m. to

2 p.m. Saturday.

"This is a big step toward MAC reopening fully to the public," Monroe Arts Center Executive Director Kathy Hennessy said in a news release. "We are excited and determined to get back to doing what we do best, creating shared experiences with our community, as soon as possible."

The Sounds of Summer

outdoor concert series will begin Wednesday, June 2, on the south lawn of MAC with no masking or social distancing requirements. Classes and events are being planned for children and families and will begin in-person with masks required only for indoor activities.

Weigh in on how federal funding should be spent in Green County

Local officials across Green County are awaiting guidance from the U.S. Treasury Department for clarity on how American Rescue Plan funds can be spent and exactly how much will be received.

To better understand the needs of people who live and work in Green County, Extension Green County and Green County Development Corp. are partnering to develop a survey to help inform local decision-makers on how to approach making decisions for using the funds most effectively and intentionally, according to a news release.

The survey is available online at the Extension

Green County website at green.extension.wisc.edu. Survey responses can be received through June 20 and respondents are asked to share the survey with others who might be interested.

Signed into law on March 11, the \$1.9 trillion American Rescue Plan Act provides the latest round of stimulus funding to address the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. The federal aid package includes \$350 billion in direct aid to states, local governments, tribes and territories. Estimates for Green County indicate that cities, villages and towns could receive more than \$10.8 million in direct aid, the release said.

The Treasury Department is responsible for making final decisions about specific guidance on allowable uses, and those details are expected in the coming months. Funds must be used by Dec. 31, 2024.

Results of the survey will be shared with decision-makers in late July.

Monroe Clinic notches 5-star rating for seventh time

A new report published by Becker's Hospital Review has shared that Monroe Clinic, a member of SSM Health, has again achieved the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) overall 5-star rating for the seventh time.

"This honor puts Monroe Clinic as part of an elite group of health care providers," according to a news release. "Only 455 out of more than 3,300 CMS-ranked hospitals received a 5-star rating in 2021."

Get grilling safely this summer

Often considered the unofficial kick-off to summer, Memorial Day weekend typically includes lots of celebrations and cookouts, often with outdoor grilling as a focal point. As the holiday and summer months near, the National Fire Protection Association is offering basic safety tips and precautions to grill and celebrate safely.

NFPA data shows that from 2014 to 2018, fire departments responded to an annual average of 10,600 home fires annually involving grills, hibachis or barbecues. This includes 4,900 structure fires and 5,700 outside or unclassified fires. These fires resulted in an annual average of 10 deaths, 160 injuries, and \$149 million in direct property damage.

The peak months for grilling fires are July (18 percent of grilling fires), June (15 percent), May (13 percent) and August (12 percent), though grill fires occur year-round. The leading causes of grill fires include failing to clean the grill, the heat source being located too close to combustible materials, leaving equipment unattended and leaks or breaks in the grill or fuel source.

"As grilling season ap-

proaches, it is important to review basic safety tips to ensure grillers are using equipment properly and safely, especially if the grill hasn't been used over the winter," Lorraine Carli, vice president of outreach and advocacy at the NFPA, said in a news release. "Establishing a fire-safe location for using your grill is also crucial. It should be a safe distance from your home and other items that can burn."

Carli notes that as people continue to stay home in response to the pandemic, there may be an increased use of grills and other outdoor cooking equipment this season, making it critically important that people be aware of safety measures.

A yearly average of 19,700 patients went to emergency rooms because of injuries involving grills. Nearly half (9,500 or 48 percent) of the injuries were thermal burns, including both burns from fire and from contact with hot objects; 5,200 thermal burns were caused by such contact or other non-fire events.

Children under 5 accounted for an average of 2,000 (39 percent) of the contact-type burns per year. These burns typically occurred when a

child bumped into, touched, or fell on the grill, grill part, or hot coals.

NFPA offers these and other tips and recommendations for enjoying a fire-safe grilling season:

- For propane grills, check the gas tank for leaks before use. (Watch NFPA's video on how to check for leaks.)
 - Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grates and in trays below the grill.
 - Place the grill well away from your home and deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
 - Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.
 - Keep children and pets at least 3 feet away from the grilling area.
 - If you use starter fluid when charcoal grilling, only use charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire. When you are finished grilling, let the coals cool completely before disposing of them in a metal container.
 - Never leave your grill unattended when in use.

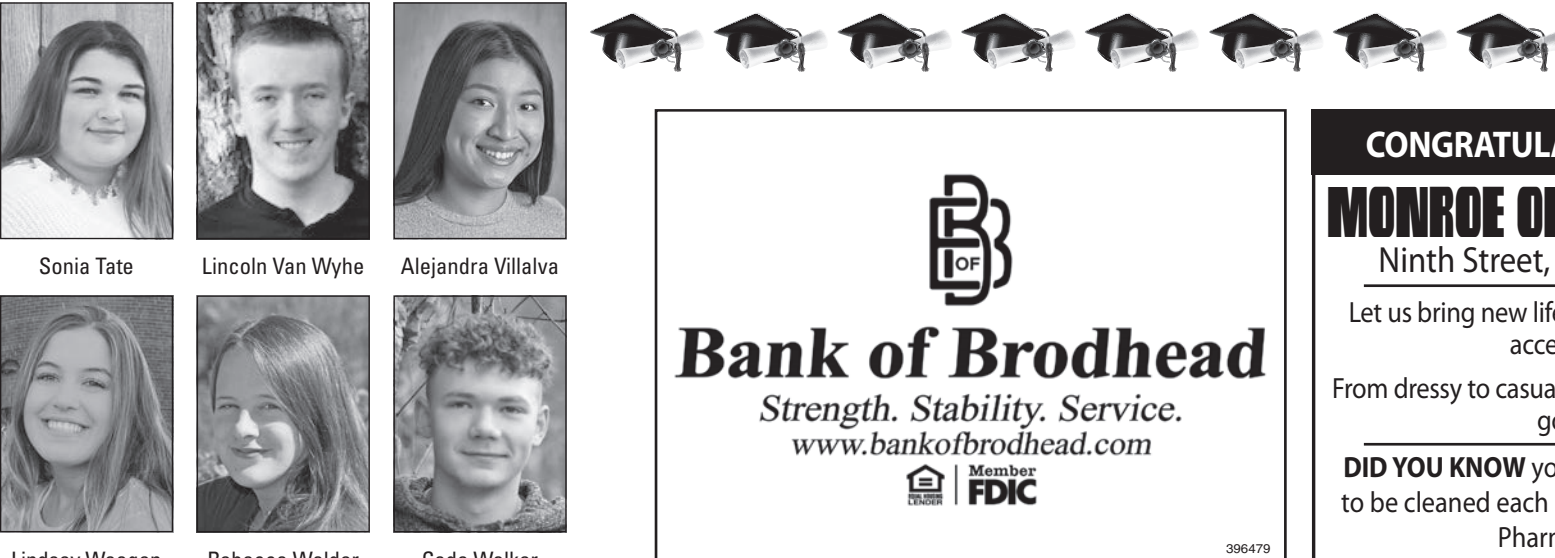

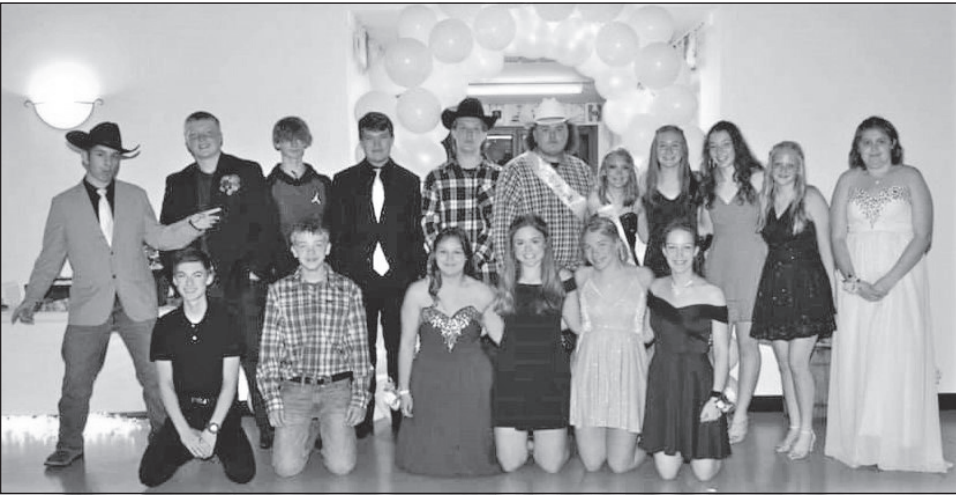
